# Treasurer's Report

---

## Treasurers Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2020

Below are the financial statements for the 2020 financial year.

The 2020 financial year has certainly been a challenging one. Individuals, families, businesses & community clubs alike have all felt the impact. As always, we all do our best to adapt and manage the ever changing situation.

After a long year we can look back on a number of significant moments along the way. Most notably being our 130<sup>th</sup> year celebrations, Healesville Open and the refurbishments to the clubhouse.

A lot of hard work by our committee and members has seen the club finish the financial year in a solid position given the economic environment. Thanks to the savvy work of our secretary Chris Wittkopp we have again been assisted in our projects by government and community sports grants.

Over the 2020 financial year Healesville Tennis Club has made a net loss of \$7,471.61. Considering the position the club has been forced to take over the pandemic period, this is an admirable outcome. A few main factors have driven this and should be taken into account when thinking about this number:

- ceasing competition (which is a significant revenue stream)
- closing the courts to members as well as court hire
- an excellent clubhouse refurbishment

Our major outlays consisted of clubhouse upgrades, our wonderful 130<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations as well as general maintenance and running of the club.

Our new Book-A-Court system has been up and running for a number of months and came into full effect as we took advantage of its functionality during Covid times as a handy tool for both contactless court access (ie. not needing to pick up a key from a retail store) as well as a log of users in case of contact tracing requirement.

As with last year, we have continued to depreciate our assets both old and new to reflect their use as this method gives our assets a more accurate representation of their current value.

After the year we've had in Victoria we as a club are stable and well positioned to bounce back better than ever when restrictions ease and we can all get back into tennis and enjoy our upgraded facilities.

- The 130th Birthday was not pinned as being a fundraiser specifically but more so a celebration of our club's history that will be a rare occurrence and so can't really be classed as fundraising. Therefore, costs relating to the event were placed into sundry expenses.
- The future leaders program costs didn't fit well into any one category. With some slight adjustments to expense category titles this can be avoided in the future. Similarly for The Women's program that Wayne facilitated, there was no clear place to allocate this cost to but with some title adjustments it could fit in the future without the need to place in sundries.

## Part D: Notes to the financial statements

### Healesville Tennis Club Club Inc.

#### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2020

##### Statement of significant accounting policies

1)

a) Statement of compliance

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on the general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

No Australian Accounting Standards have been applied.

Healesville Tennis Club is currently a Tier 1 association.

b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical cost.

All grant monies received by the club are recognised as revenue upon receipt in the income statement.

Grant amounts received by a third party on the clubs behalf for the purpose of creating/replacing club assets are recognised on the balance sheet as an increase in assets and an increase in members funds. (eg. Shire council)

2) Statement of significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

a) **Plant, equipment & depreciation**

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairments losses.

Fixed assets consist of previous years' fixed assets plus acquisitions made in the 2019 financial year. A portion of the fixed asset value has been depreciated as an expense to reflect the true current value of the asset. Depreciation is not a cash transaction.

The depreciation expense for the current year includes all current courts and new lighting.

Assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready to use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are an estimate only. They are to be reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are recognised immediately in profit and loss.

b) Income tax

The association is a not-for-profit organisation and is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.



c) Goods and services tax (GST)

GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense as the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

## **E.R.T. Senior Winter 2019 Saturday Afternoon Season.**

We entered Open Sections 3 and 9 teams. Both teams narrowly missed out on the finals, but had good, competitive seasons.

## **E.R.T. Senior Summer 2019/20 Saturday Afternoon Season.**

Again, we entered OS 3 and 9 teams, with somewhat better results.

Both teams finished in the top 4 and lost their semi-finals by small margins.

Had OS 3 won, they would have played the top team (which had only lost a handful of sets for the entire season – a blessing in disguise!) in the final.

OS 9 lost their semi-final by just 4 games (3 sets, 33 games to 3/37) in a very even competition overall.

## **E.R.T. 2020 Winter.**

Not much to report here – yet!

We only have sufficient players to enter the one team, possibly OS 8 (yet to be determined by E.R.T.).

While the intention was to play the last 7 matches of the season (starting on 19/7/20), then 2 weeks of finals, with close adherence to COVID protocols put in place by ERT, the situation with COVID-19 has devastated the Winter season and no play will be possible.

We wait to hear whether there is any opportunity for a summer season of sorts.

## **Club Championships**

These have been suspended for the time being due to lack of potential participants.

We may change the format in future to attract more entrants.
